RG2 IN 2022

In 2022 RG2 consisted of 36 integrated researchers and 22 PhD students. Our team has been involved in several successful applications to project calls. We highlight the coordination by RG2 researchers of 10 funded projects, either by national or international funding agencies.

Overall, RG2 maintained its level of scientific productivity, publishing several articles in highly relevant scientific journals, particularly international ones. RG2's work resulted in 115 publications of various types. Of these, we highlight that 46 were articles in peer-reviewed journals. We emphasize the increasing impact and internationalization of our researchers' work, with the publication of 32 articles in Q1/Q2 international journals. Additionally, we should mention the publication of 32 book chapters and, finally, the editing or coordination of 10 books, the majority of which were published by prestigious international academic publishing houses.

Members of our research group were also directly engaged in organizing 8 international scientific events, most of which had

CICSNOVA as an organizing partner or member. Noteworthy events include the 3rd edition of the annual international conference "COMbART: Art, Activism, and Citizenship"; the European congress "Uma Justiça Amiga das Crianças. Direitos Humanos e a Criança" [A Child-Friendly Justice. Human Rights and the Child]; the first international seminar "Youth and Citizenship," in partnership with Sergipe University (Brazil); the international conference "Asymétries Territoriales: Enjeux Socio-Environnementaux et Facteurs d'Inégalités"; and, finally, the "Global Meeting on Law and Society: Rage, Reckoning, & Remedy."

RG2 in 2023

In 2023, RG2 consisted of 35 integrated researchers (14 based in Lisbon – NOVA FCSH, with the remaining based in our regional hubs – 12 at Minho University, 3 at the University of the Azores, 4 at Leiria Polytechnic, and 2 at the University of Évora). This number included 4 full-time researchers (3 under contract and 1 with a post-doc scholarship) and 8 PhD students (5 of whom are grant holders – FCT grants).

RG2 researchers continue to be engaged in several relevant scientific activities. Twelve of our researchers are directly involved in various competitively funded research projects, either national or international. We emphasize that our team has been strengthened by the integration of a post-doc researcher who won a CICSNOVA scholarship to carry out her project, "Deconstructing Urban Policing: The Importance of Human Rights in Everyday Police Practices in Portugal (DECONPOL)." The goal of the project is to study police practices, understand how they are constructed, and provide a vantage point on power relations between the police and society.

We remain highly active in the dissemination of our scientific endeavors. RG2's work resulted in 101 publications, representing a slight decrease compared to last year. We published 40 articles in peer-reviewed journals, including 27 articles in Q1/Q2 international journals. Regarding books, we published 31 chapters and authored or coordinated 11 books. RG2 researchers were also actively involved in organizing several national and international scientific events. Overall, 11 events were held with the direct involvement of our members in the organizing committees. We highlight the international conferences COMbART: Art, Activism, and Citizenship, held at NOVA FCSH in July, and the AGEING CONGRESS 2023 in May.

Furthermore, our researchers were responsible for leading and co-organizing other important scientific meetings, particularly aimed at the scientific community, such as CICS.NOVA's Social Science Labs: Ethics and Responsibilities in Qualitative Research (4 sessions with international guest speakers), held in different hubs of CICSNOVA; the Webinars on Social Justice in a Digital Society (3 sessions with international guest speakers);

and the seminar: History and Sociology of Science.

RG3 IN 2023

In 2023, the RG3 team achieved significant progress in its research activities and outputs. The FCT supported a CICS.NOVA project examining COVID-19's impact on Portugal's housing market and an RG3 team joined the Horizon Europe-funded MOSAIC project, addressing climate change and biodiversity loss. Researchers published extensively in prestigious journals, including Urban History, Etnográfica, European Planning Studies and ACME. Notable editorial contributions included special issues on "Urban Transitions and Dynamics" (Land) and "Nocturnal Cities" (Forum Sociológico) and chapters in books by international publishers, such as Routledge or Palgrave, but also by widely reconized publishers in Portuguese society, such as Almedina, thus reaching diferent publics. During 2022 and 2023, the group achieved significant outputs. In 2022, published 20 articles in Scopus or Web of Science journals, including 6 in Q1 and Q2. In 2023, the group increased their output to 21 articles, with 9 in Q1 and Q2 journals. Additionally, published 20 articles in other indexed journals—9 in 2022 and 11 in 2023. One RG6 researcher coordinated a Scopus/Web of Science indexed book in 2022, and the group coordinated 16 non-indexed but peer-reviewed books over the two years. They also released 36 book chapters, including 1 in Scopus. Furthermore, RG6 was prominent in scientific dissemination, with 24 publications in international proceedings (7 peer-reviewed in 2022, 12 in 2023).

The heavy economic, social, and psychological toll of pandemic lockdowns around the world and their disproportionate effect on women are widely acknowledged, but different socioeconomic backgrounds and contexts may influence the degree to which stay-at-home measures impact their lives. Additionally, knowing that violence against women tends to increase during times of crisis, we are testing if the additional burden of victimization represents an added load to the perceived social impacts of the lockdown. Using 2021 survey data from a random sample of 1541 Portuguese women, the paper explores, through logistic regression models, the social impact of the lockdown on the lives of women, its socioeconomic determinants, and the role played by violence against women during the pandemic. The results show that the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown did not equally affect all facets of women's social lives, and women with higher education status and that experienced income reductions due to the measures taken to control the pandemic are more prone to experience a more severe negative impact of the lockdown on the various facets of their lives. Additionally, having been a victim during the pandemic partially mediates the effect of education and income reduction on the social outcomes of the lockdown.

DYSREGULATED ERYTHROID MG2+ EFFLUX IN TYPE 2 DIABETES

Hyperglycemia is associated with decreased Mg2+ content in red blood cells (RBC), but mechanisms remain unclear. We characterized the regulation of Mg2+ efflux by glucose in ex vivo human RBC. We observed that hemoglobin A1C (HbA1C) values correlated with Na+-dependent Mg2+ efflux (Na+/Mg2+ exchange) and inversely correlated with cellular Mg content. Treatment of cells with 50 mM D-glucose, but not with sorbitol, lowered total cellular Mg (2.2 ± 0.1 to 2.0 ± 0.1 mM, p < 0.01) and enhanced Na+/Mg2+ exchange activity $[0.60 \pm 0.09 \text{ to } 1.12 \pm 0.09 \text{ mmol}/1013]$ cell × h (flux units, FU), p < 0.05]. In contrast, incubation with selective Src family kinase inhibitors PP2 or SU6656 reduced glucose-stimulated exchange activation (p < 0.01). Na+/Mg2+ exchange activity was also higher in RBC from individuals with type 2 diabetes (T2D, 1.19 ± 0.13 FU) than from non-diabetic individuals (0.58 \pm 0.05 FU, p < 0.01). Increased Na+/Mg2+ exchange activity in RBC from T2D subjects was associated with lower intracellular Mg content. Similarly increased exchange activity was evident in RBC from the diabetic db/db mouse model as compared to its non-diabetic control (p < 0.03). Extracellular exposure of intact RBC from T2D subjects to recombinant peptidyl-N-glycosidase F (PNGase F) reduced Na+/Mg2+ exchange activity from 0.98 ± 0.14 to 0.59 ± 0.13 FU (p < 0.05) and increased baseline intracellular Mg content (1.8 \pm 0.1 mM) to normal values (2.1 \pm 0.1 mM, p < 0.05). These data suggest that the reduced RBC Mg content of T2D RBC reflects enhanced RBC Na+/Mg2+ exchange subject to regulation by Src family kinases and by the N-glycosylation state of one or more membrane proteins. The data extend our understanding of dysregulated RBC Mg2+ homeostasis in T2D.

PROTECTING GREAT APES FROM DISEASE: COMPLIANCE WITH MEASURES TO REDUCE ANTHROPONOTIC DISEASE TRANSMISSION

- 1. The emergence of infectious diseases, such as COVID-19, impacts livelihood strategies and conservation tools reliant on human-wildlife interactions, such as wildlife-based tourism and research. This is particularly relevant to great ape conservation, as humans and great apes are susceptible to being infected by similar pathogens.
- 2. Evidence-based strategies are required to prevent infectious disease transmission to great apes and people involved in, or living close to, tourism sites. The development of disease-safe recommendations and their effective operationalisation require an understanding of what affects visitor compliance.
- 3. Based on an international sample of past (N = 420) and potential future visitors (N = 569) to wild great ape tourism sites in Africa, we used an online questionnaire to characterise visitors' practices, assess expectations (e.g. about proximity to great apes) and identify key factors related to potential compliance with disease mitigation measures. This was implemented adapting a framework from health literature (the Health Belief Model; HBM), particularly focused on reducing COVID-19 transmission at an early stage of the pandemic.
- 4. Visitors expressed less willingness to being vaccinated against COVID-19 (which, at the time our survey was conducted, had only just started being administered to very high-risk groups), wearing a facemask during trekking (although willing when viewing the apes) and quarantine after international travel before visiting great apes. Region of nationality, expectations about the visitor experience and perceived effectiveness of specific measures were important factors explaining variation in potential compliance across multiple behaviours.
- 5. By gaining a better understanding of what fosters compliance with disease mitigation measures, we obtained insights that are essential for assessing feasibility, facilitating effective communication, and guiding implementation at great ape tourism sites with importance not only for COVID-19 but also for other infectious diseases more broadly, particularly at early stages of future pandemics. While requiring adaptive management as situations evolve (e.g. vaccination becoming more widely accessible), these will contribute towards a more sustainable visitor experience that can effectively deliver positive outcomes for people and biodiversity.

Obesity and global warming are two major challenges that affect communities' health and quality of life. Providing good walking environments, with appropriate pedestrian infrastructure, green areas and access to commercial retail and transport hubs favour liveable, healthy, and sustainable cities. The Lisbon City Hall has implemented an intervention program in the public space as a strategy to improve environmental quality and mitigate the effects of climate change. The program "A square in each neighbourhood" intends not only to reinforce the economic base of Lisbon, namely tourism, restaurants, commerce, and creative activities but also to promote physical activity and improve the quality of living of all citizens. For studying the impact of the public space quality on the walking environment, Campolide, a typical Lisbon neighbourhood, Portugal, which includes one of the requalified squares, was selected. A two-step methodology based on spatial modelling is proposed. In the first step, the public space quality was evaluated based on a set of 13 urban quality attributes. Attributes, intended for the street level, were collected from open data platforms and complemented with a field survey. Then, through spatial analysis, these attributes were used to build the Pedestrian Environment Quality Indicator and the Priority Intervention Indicator. Using these indicators, walking-friendly streets were mapped and the most critical sites that require priority intervention were identified to prepare for the requalification planning process. The street with the highest quality in the study area according to the dimensions evaluated - connectivity, convenience, comfort, cleanliness, and conviviality - has a great offer of trees, bus stops, commercial establishments, commercial diversity, crossings, paper bins/eco points and esplanades. On the opposite side of the rank, the street with the lowest quality has no trees or green areas, transport stops, benches and tables, or commercial activity. The urban quality indicators constitute a helpful tool for city planners and policymakers when planning sustainable living neighbourhoods.





This paper discusses to what extent land is considered in food-related policies from a systemic perspective. Based on existing literature and international agendas priorities, we argue that access to and preservation of land for food along the food chain play a major role in sustainable food systems. To further explore this argument, we address the following question: Where does land stand in sectorial and national food-related policies? The multiple dimensions and implications of food systems and the international agenda's priorities namely the "Right to adequate Food", "Food Sovereignty" and the "Right to Land", were used as our conceptual framework. To work out how land is being considered in food sectorial policies, both quantitative and qualitative methods were applied to examine ten Portuguese national food-related policies. Results are showing a lack of consideration for land access and land preservation, needed all along the food chain to build a national sustainable food system. On the other hand, there is a gap between current grassroots priorities international agendas and food-related national policies. Such a situation strongly suggests that building a sustainable food system needs a clear food territorial perspective, still neglected, and shifting from sectorial policies towards a more integrated food system approach, that will include land as a central piece.



100 YEARS OF LAND-USE AND LAND-COVER DATA: WHAT HAS BEEN THE EFFECT OF SPATIAL PLANNING IN COASTAL LAND-USE AND LAND-COVER CHANGE?

The Sustainable Development Goals require us to rethink spatial planning policies' effectiveness. This article proposes a reproducible method for assessing the effect of past planning practices and simulating future land-use and land-cover (LULC) changes with a Cellular Automata model. The originality of our approach is to systematically compare observed changes in LULC with the planning rules in force over almost a century of evolution. A quasi-exhaustive database was constructed at a very fine spatial resolution for the municipality of Portimão (Southern Portugal), including the location and changes of LULC categories, and the planning rules of the corresponding time period on nine dates between 1947 and 2018. The quantified measurement of the actual effect of planning rules enables us to identify other determinants of the evolution. Findings reveal that the policies established by the local government—which aimed to foster well-planned comprehensive urban areas—were not as effective as intended. The quantified discrepancies between planning recommendations and observed evolution help to simulate which LULC scenarios could be designed to reach the expected result in future planning policies. Our assessment method could be applied in other urban and tourist regions where land artificialization exerts strong pressure on the environment.

This article aims to understand the irregular migration networks between Portugal and France (1957-1974), focusing on the relationships between illegal agents (smugglers, recruiters, etc.) and regional and local State agents in the border contexts where irregularities were most prevalent. Starting from the government's contradictory positions on the migration issue and analyzing the effective implementation of migration policies by state agents on the ground, we seek to identify the factors that explain the effectiveness of irregular networks. The study is based mainly on oral sources, complemented with documentation from national, regional, and municipal archives. We argue that the "differentiated management of illegality" within or between state institutions produced duplicities and discretions that compromised the effectiveness of migration regulatory measures, while at the same time reflecting the government's ambiguity in this matter.

CICS.NOVA is committed to Open Science, to make scientific knowledge available, accessible, and reusable to the scientific community, marketplace and civil society. The promotion and implementation of Open Access in our researchers' publications, but also in our own editions, is part of that commitment to the democratization of the produced knowledge.

We are permanently involved in and committed to discussions and activities of national and international impact to fully implement best practices of scientific publishing. Hence, we continued to be part of the NOVA FCSH Open Science Working Group (GTCA), in which we were particularly active during the activities of the 2022 and 2023 «Open Science Month at NOVA FCSH», an annual event that emerged on the scope of the celebrations of the International Open Access Week 2021 (OA week 2021).

Throughout 2022 and 2023 we were able to implement and consolidate best practices as recommended by international organizations such as COPE (Committee on Publication Ethics), OASPA (Open Access Scholarly Publishing Association), DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals) and SPARC Europe. This also translated into a more close and efficient support to our researchers and members of the Editorial Boards of the Centre's editions. Being a R&D Unit also committed to the development of quality interdisciplinary research, we encourage and value in our editions the publishing of collaborative scientific works, by national and international researchers and not exclusively in the Social Sciences, which aims to integrate the produced scientific knowledge to comprehend and respond to the complexity of contemporary societal problems, a perspective fostered and leveraged by a growing number of organizations such as FCT, European Commission and UNESCO.




